READY AND AWAITING "THE OFF" FOR SOMEWHER IN FRANCE. BUT WHERE? THE WEATHER TOOK A TURN FOR THE WORSE AND DEPARTURE WAS DELAYED FOR. 24 HOURS ON THE MORNING OF JUNE THE HTH

THE WEATHER DID NOT SEEM TO GET AMY BETTOR
BUT DISPITE THIS DISRUPTION TO HIGHER PEOPLES PLANS

BUT DISPITE THIS DISRUPTION TO HIGHER PEOPLES PLANS MIDDAY ON JUNE THE 5TH DISITIONS WERE MADE TO MOVE OFF.

SHIPS ENGINES STARTED TO THROB AND WE WERE OFF TO SOMEWHERE IN FRANCE.

THIS WAS THE MOMENT, WE THE SPESIALIST UNITS HAD BEEN TRAINING 2 YEARS FOR.

MOST OUR REGIMENT THE 13/18 HUSSARS WERE ABOUT TO
FACE UP ENEMY ACTION FOR OUR FIRST TIME. SURROUNED
BY OUR. TANKS ON BOARD THE TANK LANDING CRAFT
L.C.T.

THE CROSSING WAS ROUGH AND WE SAW PICTURES AND PHOTOGRAPHES OF OUR OBJECTIVES. IT WAS MORMANDY AT ABOUT TO GEDOCK IN THE MORNING WE WERE NOW ABOARD OUR TANKS AND WARMING UP THE ENGINES AT TO ACLOCK WE WE LAUNCHED 'OUR TANKS AT 5000 YDS' FROM THE BEACHES. OUR TANKS WHICH WERE AMPHIBEOUS WE NOW HEADING FOR THE UNKNOWING PART OF NORMANDY. BECAUSE WE HAD DONE OUR TRAINING IN THE NORTH OF SCOTLAND WE WERE OVER AWED BY THE ROUGH SEA. WHICH WE HAD EXPERIENCED ON 'NORTH WATERS OF THE MOREY FORTH AND THIS RESULTED IN OUR REGIMENT WE THE DONLY ONE TO LAWNCHED AT SEA

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2 IT TOOK APPROX. 30 MINS. TO REACH THE BEACH
AT WHICH POINT WE NOW FIRING AT SELECTED TARGETS FOR
EACH TANK. AT THIS POINT THE TANK I WAS ON WAS
SWAMPED BY THE VERY FAST INCOMING TIDE. I SWAM THE
200/300 YARDS TO THE SHORE AND SAT AGAINST THE SAND
WHICH WAS NEAR THE PROMANADE NEAR HERMANDVILLE,

AND OUISTREAHAMIT WAS NOT VERY LONG I SAW ONE OF OUR RECOVERY TANKS
COMING UP THE BEACH AND CLAMPERED ON BOURD AND WAS
RIVING A LIFT INTO HERMANVILLE AND WAS DEOPPED OFF
THE CHURCH. THERE I MET 2 OTHER MEMBERS OF OUR CREW
AND WE DUG A TRENCH FOR THE 3 OF US WERE SETTLED INTO
UNTIL WE ACQUIRED SOME SORT OF WENDONS. AFTER WE GOT,
3 STEN'GUNS WE NOW GOT OUT I'N TO HERM ANVILLE AND FIND
OUT WAS HAPPENING. IT WAS NOT VERY LONG BEFORE WE DISCOVERED
THERE WAS A SHIPER FROM SOMEWHERE WAS SHOOTING OTHER
SOLDIERS IN THE VILLAGE.

IT WAS NOT VERY LONG BEFORE SOMEONE THOUGHT IT WAS COMING FROM THE TOP OF THE CHURCH. SOMEONE GOT THE HOLD OF PLAT RIFLE (BAZOOKA) TOOK AIM AT THE CHURCH TOWER (YOUCAN STILL SEE NEW STONES) AND IN WE WENT AND FOUND ONT THAT OUR SNIPER FRIEND HAD BEEN KILLED BY THE EXPLOSION. WHILST WE WERE AWAITING A REPLACEMENT TANK WE DISCOVERED ONE OF OUR GREW HAD BEEN DROWNED BURIED IN HERMANVILLE CEMETRY WHICH I VISIT ANY TIME I AM IN NORMANDY HIS NAME I'S JOHN HUGHES AGE 264EARS.

BY THE END OF WEEK WE HAD A NEW TANK PLUS 2 NEW CREW
MEMBERS _ WE JOINED 'A' SQUADRON AND NOW BACK
IN ACTION. WE SWEPT ROUND INTO LYON SUR MERE
AND DID A BIT OF TIDYING UP 'ALONG THE BIT OF COASTLINE
STILL HELD BY THE GERMANS. WHILE THIS WAS GOING
ON SHELLS FROM THE BATTLESHIPS WERE ADDING TO
THE EXPLODING FROM TANKS AND THE ENTEMY AND
AT THE END OF THIS EYERSIZE A FAIR NUMEBER OF GUN
ENPLACEMENTS WE DISTROYED AND A LARGE NO OF THE
ENEMY CAPTURED, AFTER IMMEDIATE FIGHTING AROUND
HERHANVILE WE MOVED IN THEDIRECTION OF LION SUR MERE
TO TIDY UP POCKET OF RESISTANCE IN AROUND THAT AREA

3 WE HOVED ON TO BENOUVELLE TO STIFFEN UP THE AIRBOURNE TROOPS WHO HAD BEEN HOLDING UP GERMAN AFTACKS ON THE BRIDGE (PECASUS) WHICH WAS VITAL IN ATTACKS ON STOPPING UP THE SUPPLIES ON THE BEACHES. AFTER THIS WE MOVED ON TO RANVILLE AND HELPED ANOTHER UNIT OF THE AIRBOURNE WHO WERE TRYING TO FIGHT OFF. THE GERMANS IN THAT AREA, WE WENT INTO RESERVE WHILST BEQUADRON ATTACKED TO WORDS LABITUDE AND ON TO AUBERGE AND MOVING TOWARDS CAEN WHICH THE GERMANS WERE HOLDING ON TENACICALY WHER WE SHOULD HAVE TAKEN IN THE FIRST WEEK AFTER "D' DAY. THE REASON FOR THE HOLD UP WAS THE VITAL ROAD JUNCTION WAS DEFENDED BY THE GERMANS WHO COULD PICK THEIR HIDDEN GUNS AND TANKS WHEREAS THE ATTACKERS WHERE DRIVING INTO UNSEEN ENEMY WHO WHERE WATING FOR THEIR ATTACKER, BOMBERS WHERE CALLEDINTO ATTACK THESE DIFFICUST DEFENDERS AND CAEN WAS BOMBED TO THE DEATH OF MANY OF THE CIVILIANS. THIS GAVE NO SATISFACTION TO BRITISH TROOPS BUT THEY WERE ALSO DYING FOR THE LIBERATION. OF FRANCE. MEANTIME THE 13/18 HUSSARS WERE FIGHTING TO WARDS VILLERS BOCAGE. AND ON TO AUNAY SUR ODON WATH A VIEW TO GETTING NETER TO MONT PINCON, AFTER DAYS OF FIGHTING WE ARRIVED AT CHANTIPIE. AHEAD WAS THE FORMIDME MONTY. AFTER 4 DAYS TRYING TO CAPTURE THIS DIFICULT OBJECTIVE AND SUFFERING A NUMBER OF CASUATYS AND GETTING NOWERE LADY LUCK CAME TO OUR AID. AN EARLY EVENING MIST SETTLED DOWN OVER THE AREA CAPTAIN DENNY AND EIGHT OTHER TANKS FOUND A WAY TO THE TOP OF MONT PINCON. FROM THIS POSITION WE COULD HEAR THE ENOMY WHO COULD HEAR US BUT COULD NOT SEEUS, WE FIRED A NUMBER OF SHELLS IN THEIR DIRECTION AND CONTINUED DURING THE NIGHT CAUSING THE GERMANS TO PULL OUT OF THIS DIFICULT OBJECTIVE. THE SUPPORTING INFANTRY ARRIVED TO JOIN US AND "MONT" WAS OURS. THE CAPTURE OF MONT PICON WAS THE TURNING OF THE WAR IN NORANDY WITH THE BOCAGE COUNTRY AND OPEN PLANS WHICH LED TO THE BIG RETREAT OF THE SERMANS. NOW WERE ON THE ROAD TO FALAISE WHERE THE LOSS OF EQUIPMENTETCETRA

4 WAS TREMENDOUS. WE PUSHED ON TO PUTANGES FOLLOW BY ARGENTAN WHERE WE CLEAND UP A GERTAN DEFENSIVE POCKET WHICH DID NOT HAVE THE HEART TO DEFEND. AFER THIS WE RODE ON TO LAIGLE ON TO EVREUX FOLLOWED BY VERNON WHICH WAS CROSSED BY A BAILEY BRIDGE CONSTRUCTED BY OUR ENGINEERS WHICH WE CROSSED ON THE 28TH OF AVGUST, AND AFTER WHICH WE MOVED ON TO GISORS. IN DISCRIBING THESE PLACES IF HAVE NOT SPOKEN ABOUT THE CASUALTIES WE SUFFERED FIGHTING TARBUGH THE REARGUARDS OF THE GERMANS WHO WERETRYING TO DELAY US WE WORK NOT BE STUPPED. IT WAS ON TO BEAUVAIS, AMIENS ARRAS - AMIENS AND ON TO THE BRIDGE, MEANWHILE "A" AND B" SQUADRENS WENT TO THE RIGHT FLANK TO STOP THE ENEMY FROM WITHDRAWING FROM DOULLENS BUT WHEN THE GOT THERE THEY SAW THAT SPITFIRES HAD GOT THERE FIRST AND HAD MESSED UP THE GERMANS, LENVING A MESS OF DEAD, WOUNDED AND LOTS OF EQUIPMENT. THE REGIMENT HAD DRIVEN 100 MILES SINCE NORMANDY AND CROSSING THE SEINE. IT WAS NOW ON TO BELGUM, WE CROSED THE BORDER AT BAISIEUX AND ON TO BRUSSELS WERE WHERE THE POPULATION WERE OUT IN THEIR THOUSANDS GIVING THE TROOPS AT GREAT WELLOUM, THIS COVERS MOST OF THE BATTLES IN FRANCE AND THE MAIN MEMORIES, ARE MONT PINCON NOT FORGETTING THE LANDINGS. ON THE BEACHES. WHICH I HOPE TO RETURN ABOUT 6TH OF JUNE 2004

YOU WILL FIND THE MORIAL MOUNUMENT AT THE TOP OF THE MONT, AND IN THE SMALL MEVSEM BETEEN OUISTREHAM AND HERMANVILLE WHO HAVE MODELS OF THE SWIMMING TANKS WHICH WE USED FOR THE LANDING
